### MARCH 12 PROGRAM:

Toni Lott will present and demonstrate "Tools of the Trade". Her subject will be framing and the selection and use of framers' tools. While she will discuss the selection of the proper type of glass (regular or non-glare) and mats (regular, acid free or rag), she will also demonstrate the cutting of a double mat. Additionally, she will discuss the best ways to hinge your art. As always, attendees' questions will be welcomed.

### APRIL 9 PROGRAM:

Norma Eaton has agreed to present views on design composition. There are a number of design concepts that all of us need to incorporate into our work. Norma will share six that she feels are essential. She will present a series of samples via a slide show with a different flaw in them that clearly demonstrate how important these concepts can be. Examples of art from professionals and masters will help you see the concept in use and when they might be ignored. Then you will be challenged to apply the concept to a scene. This presentation with some audience participation will help you see how you can work through these design essentials when you begin a painting.

### MAY 14 PROGRAM:

Sr. Sherry Dolan will discuss "Art in Healing" at Mercy Hospital - who they are, what they do and how, as well as their need for local community artisan and volunteer support. She will also comment on why art making is so important for physical, emotional and spiritual healing (of course all artists know that already). After sharing some stories of people's experiences in the program she will talk about the programs offered in the Art and Spirituality Center (formerly the Sisters of Mercy Chapel on Truxtun Ave).

### JUNE 11 PROGRAM:
